- Shipping details to be filled in by person sending seed; Port of arrival will be Launceston
 - 24 hours before posting the seed, email the Nol to Nol.Biosecurity@dpiwwe.tas.gov.au as on Nol form. (Phone 03 6777 2161).
 - Nol needs to be completed for all consignments. If there are multiple shipments a Nol to import seed needs to be submitted for each separate shipment.
 - With multiple entries in one shipment an attachment needs to be provided listing variety names and quantity of each.
 - Must not be a restricted seed species e.g. field peas, lupins as there are additional entry conditions that apply. Wheat, barley are OK.
 - There should not be 1kg per line sent as a certificate is then required to show that there are no impurities or contamination (to be conducted through an independent lab).
 - With less than 1kg per line being sent –won't need a certificate.
 - Minimum costs are around \$37
ie Inspection paperwork: \$18.36
 Inspections service cost min \$18.36
- There will likely be additional cost with extra time to check each line for contamination/purity - probably \$18 per extra 15 min unit.
